¹ Note that the MEOS researchers can supervise students from departments other than their own based on their expertise and prior agreement between departments.

MASTER'S GRANT

Application deadline: June 12, 2009

Grant amount: \$8,000 from September 1, 2009 to August 31, 2010

Admission requirements:

- admitted to a full-time master's degree program
- GPA of 3.7 or more (or equivalent).
- supervised by a MEOS researcher for a master's degree project based on a MEOS-related topic

Requirements for MEOS grant recipients:

- actively participate in MEOS activities
- submit a scholarship application to at least one awarding organization (e.g. SSHRC, FQRSC) during the academic year in which the MEOS grant is offered.
- submit an article to a peer-reviewed journal on a MEOS-related topic (preferably in collaboration with the MEOS supervisor or another MEOS researcher) before June 1 of the year in which the grant is offered
- not be employed for more than 15 hours per week

Documents required:

- résumé
- research project summary (maximum 2 pages)
- copy of latest transcripts
- two letters of recommendation

DOCTORAL GRANT

Grant amount: \$12,000 from September 1, 2009 to August 31, 2010

Admission requirements:

- admitted to a full time PhD program
- GPA of 3.7 or more (or equivalent).
- supervised by a MEOS researcher for a doctoral thesis project based on a MEOS-related topic

Requirements for MEOS grant recipients:

- actively participate in MEOS activities
- submit a scholarship application to at least one awarding organization (e.g. SSHRC, FQRSC) during the academic year in which the MEOS grant is offered
- submit an article to a peer-reviewed journal on a MEOS-related topic (preferably in collaboration with the MEOS supervisor or another MEOS researcher) before June 1 of the year in which the grant is offered
- not be employed for more than 15 hours per week

POSTDOCTORAL GRANT

- ❖ Postdoctoral grants are intended for resident or foreign candidates who have an excellent academic record and are likely to obtain a scholarship from a recognized awarding organization in the following year or, as foreign candidates, are not eligible for the scholarship.

Application deadline: June 12, 2009

Grant amount: \$20,000 from September 1, 2009 to August 31, 2010

Admission requirements:

- hold a PhD degree
- GPA of 3.7 or more (or equivalent)
- supervised by a MEOS researcher for a postdoctoral thesis project based on a MEOS-related topic

Requirements for MEOS grant recipients:

- actively participate in MEOS activities
- submit a scholarship application to at least one awarding organization (e.g. SSHRC, FQRSC) during the academic year in which the MEOS grant is offered
- submit an article to a peer-reviewed journal on a MEOS-related topic (preferably in collaboration with the MEOS supervisor or another MEOS researcher) before June 1 of the year in which the grant is offered
- not be employed for more than 15 hours per week
